*Post Production on Woodford Documentary In Progress*

PRINCETON, KY—December 10, 2012—Kentucky film producer Samuel Koltinsky, owner of Marvo Entertainment Group LLC, announces that the two-hour documentary project, “My Kentucky Home: Woodford County,” the latest in Marvo’s award winning *My Kentucky Home* series, is now in post production. In an interview with 17 year-old Will Pagan, an outstanding Woodford County Boy Scout, when asked what he would do if he had the opportunity to be in a community leadership role, he responded, “At this point I would hope that what I would be able to offer are pragmatic solutions and an openness to compromise. I think that would be a fairly critical thing at this current juncture.” Pagan’s willingness to share his leadership skills is highlighted by his efforts in the preservation work on the Huntertown African American Cemetery.

Conservation efforts remain in the forefront of Marvo’s work as evidenced by the successful release of *America’s Darling: The Story of Jay N. “Ding” Darling*, currently premiering around the country. Both Darling and Woodford County’s Clifford Berryman were recognized as Pulitzer Prize winning cartoonists, and research has revealed a connection between the two men through the discovery of a 1954 letter from Darling to Berryman while both were working in Washington D. C. Woodford County resident, Thomas Brown, owner of a 130-year-old home in Clifton that he has traced through deeds back to a Berryman family, has enjoyed researching Clifford Berryman. Brown said, “I’ve read that Clifford for a short time was a scribe in the Woodford County Court. I’ve looked in the old court books, and the penmanship is astonishing. In some of the books there are little artistic drawings of things in binders, and I kind of wonder if maybe it’s true that Clifford was sketching on the side when he was listening to court proceedings.” Executive producer Koltinsky added, “Our team has uncovered a number of surprises from around the country associated with Berryman. A beloved figure by Presidents and leaders alike is a pivotal part of Berryman’s legacy as well as the legacy of Woodford County.”

In support of the final underwriting efforts for the documentary, an exciting new \$5,000 challenge grant from an anonymous donor has been offered—a true Woodford Christmas gift! In the spirit of this special season of the year along with recognizing this generous challenge, Marvo is proud to announce that it will add to the challenge a production value amountt of \$3,500. With the total of \$8,500 being matched on a two to one ratio (one dollar provided for every two dollars committed), final funding can be completed by utilizing this generous opportunity. Marvo looks forward to releasing “My Kentucky Home: Woodford County” when funding for the project has been completed.

Through the generosity of several major underwriters, the amount needed to complete funding is less than \$25,000 of the \$90,000 total budget.
