A two-hour documentary dedicated to the history and attributes of our unique and remarkable Woodford County and its special place in the tapestry of Kentucky! Over two years in the making, highlighted by the thoughts and perspectives of our own citizens from in-depth interviews, graced by scenes from across the county of our irreplaceable farmland, historic and charming downtowns, hamlets, and world class landscapes---it will be a treasure for years to come. The Woodford Pulitzer Prize winning cartoonist, Clifford Berryman's teddy bear saga continues. A recent interview with Lisa Johnson at her home disclosed a special find. "I found the teddy bear in the attic about 20 years ago during one of our major "attic clean ups". He was wrapped in some sort of plastic and stuffed in a corner of a big wooden chest. His face was so sweet and his fur an unusual shade, sort of a mousey grey. I could see a hint of straw stuffing peaking out of the holes on his wellloved paws. I rescued him and laid him in a clean box lined with tissue.

In 2008, I had the opportunity to take him to the Antiques Roadshow while they were filming in Louisville. While waiting in the long line, many people peered in to see my little bear. He smiled his old, sad smile at each of them and I know he reminded many people of well-loved bears from childhoods past. The 'Antique Toys Expert' told me that my bear was an original "Steiff" bear as evidenced by the metal tag still in his ear. He was likely one of the first bears to have been produced at the turn of the century, right around 1903 or 1904. The 1903 date corresponds with the year my husband's great aunt had been born- November 3, 1903. The expert also said that he was originally a white bear because he had shoe-button eyes and his sewn- on nose was brown. (The grey and brown bears had black noses). In his current condition he is worth(take a guess!) but his memories are...priceless."

Through the generosity of several major underwriters, the amount needed to complete funding is only \$27,480 of the \$90,000 total budget. Executive producer, Sam Koltinsky, stated, "We are so close in finalizing our budget for this project.
